



The Urban League of Broward County partnered with the State of Florida Department of Health and Broward County to open the first of two walk-up COVID-19 testing sites, serving over **6,600** residents

FOOD INSECURITY

In an urgent response to the needs of families, the Urban League deployed our volunteer network to various food distribution sites, serving more than **3,000** families.

EMERGENCY RELIEF

Broward County disbursed more than \$160,000 emergency relief funds to nearly 200 families through the Urban League of Broward County's Families First Fund, seeded by The Jim Moran Foundation and United Way of Broward County.
